## Meals on Wheels Spotlight with Aileen Alcorn

Aileen has been working with Meals on Wheels for over 30 years and started when the service was based at the Harden District Hospital. Here is what she has to say:

Why do you volunteer in this way? Because it is very enjoyable and rewarding. The folk to whom we



deliver meals often like a chat. It is always a pleasant encounter. The face-to-face contact is important for people's welfare. Seeing them regularly also allows us to pick up on problems or concerns before they become too serious.

What to you actually do? Once a month, on a Tuesday, I deliver meals with Judy Dunn who has been involved with

Meals on Wheels for over 50 years! It is good to go as a pair. We support each other and it is better to have a second person present in case of unforeseen situations. We deliver frozen meals and hot meals depending on needs, often helping folk to undo packaging. We can see up to ten people on the day.

What else is good about this service? It is a comfort to other family members knowing that Meals on Wheels is available, being used and that their loved ones - often frail, elderly or vulnerable in some way - are enjoying well-presented and nourishing meals.

Any interesting stories? Well, I do remember many years ago delivering meals to retired dentist Mr Geoff Kruger. He loved to chat and grew his own vegies. He did enjoy the meals provided. I still have a shrub in my garden given to me on one occasion by Mr Kruger.

Would you recommend volunteering like this for others? Definitely! It is a very worthwhile community outreach where you can help local folk in very practical ways.

HISTORICAL NOTE: On 15th August 1967, the first meeting of Murrumburrah-Harden Meals on Wheels was held at the property of Mr & Mrs R A Littlejohn, 'The Meadows', Harden. Shortly after, Dr N Joseph requested meals be delivered to Mrs Gentle. The local Hospital Board approved the request. Mrs Gentle received five meals weekly at a cost of 25 cents per meal.
