## NEWS FROM YOUR BOARD

These past few months have been exciting times at Flexible Care

Services, as we adjust to our new premises (formerly the RFS building in the Trinity Centre, Harden). It has also been very challenging as we adapt to continually changing COVID conditions.



Our volunteer drivers are not travelling to the Greater Sydney area at present due to the lock down, but are busy with trips to all other regional areas where our clients have appointments or business. However, our bus to Orange for skin cancer checks is fine (despite the recent regional lock down in this area) - see below for the schedule of trips for the rest of the year.



Since the last newsletter in May, we were successful in obtaining a federal grant to assist with moving into our new premises and preparing it for our needs. The grant was for \$13,500 following our *Stronger Communities Programme Round 6* application earlier this year. This grant has allowed us to paint the inside of the premises, purchase a suitable front door, install curtains, purchase a fridge and other kitchenware, rationalise security, set up phones, internet, computer networking and much more.

I am pleased to mention that we have teamed with *CanAssist* who will occupy some of the building space on the western end of the premises for meetings, office space and storage. It is wonderful to create a social hub here in the Trinity Centre with some shared facilities. The new training room has been put to good use lately with several courses made available to volunteers - Transporting Passengers with Disabilities and CPR/First-Aid.

This newsletter has been extended this time to share the amazing work that has been done in the local community with clients, staff and volunteers.

With all decisions made by our talented and hard-working Board members, we always keep up front why we are here: **to assist vulnerable and frail-aged local folk to live comfortably and independently in their own homes where appropriate to do so, helping them to access services readily available to other more able members of the community.**

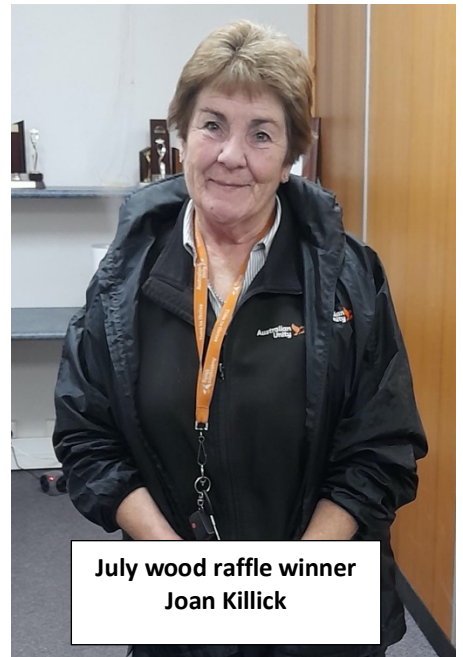

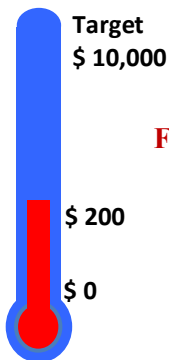
## RAFFLE RESULTS
